

DAY 01: ARRIVAL IN NEW DELHI

Arrive in New Delhi. Transfer to your hotel, Proceed for Half-day sightseeing of New Delhi, Pproceed for tour of New Delhi, which reflects the legacy the British left behind. The division between New and Old Delhi is the division between the capitals of the British and the Mughals respectively. The division in the walled city and New Delhi also marks the division in the life-styles. The walled city is all tradition where one will be able to glean a past life-style in all its facets, colours and spells. New Delhi in contrast, is a city trying to live up to the best of 21st century standards.

The tour to Imperial Delhi will start by visit to the Qutab Minar, the tallest stone tower in India. The Qutab Minar was started in 1199 AD by Qutab-ud-Din Aibak and completed by the sultan's successor and son-in-law, Iltutmish. The building is 72.5 m high and has 379 steps from the bottom to the top. The Minar is tapering with the diameter of the base is 14.3 m while at the top floorit is 2.7 m. The Qutab Minar is still the highest stone tower as well as one of the finest Islamic structures ever raised in India.





Later visit Humayun's Tomb, built by the widow of the second Mughal Emperor, Humayun, it is an outstanding monument in the Indo-Persian style, a precursor of the Taj Mahal.

Drive past the imposing India Gate, the Parliament buildingand the Rashtrapati Bhawan, the President's residence.

Proceed to see The Lotus Temple derives its name from its design. Like every other Bahā'ī mashriq, it is

DAY 02: IN NEW DELHI

After breakfast, set out for an excursion to see Old Delhi today. Proceed for full day sightseeing of Old Delhi. Old Delhi, the Mughal Capital of Shahjahanabad. Visit the Jama Masjid which is the principal mosque of Old Delhi in India. Commissioned by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan, builder of the Taj Mahal, and completed in the year 1656 AD, it is the largest and best-known mosque in India. It lies at the origin of a very busy central street of Old Delhi, the Chawri Bazar Road. The mosque of Friday was

built from 1644 to 1658 during the reign of Shahjahan. The mosque is 80 m long and 27 m wide. The courtyard can accommodate 25,000 worshippers and occupies 408 square feet.





Later we proceed to visit Raj Ghat where Mahatma Gandhi – The Father of Nation, was cremated followed by a photo stop at the Red Fort - the palace for Shahjahan's new capital, Shahjahanabad, the seventh Muslim city in the Delhi site. Wander in the busy streets of the mile long Chandni Chowk, popularly called "The Silver Street". Enjoy the 'Cycle Rickshaw' ride in Old Delhi. Overnight stay at your Hotel.

DAY 03: NEW DELHI - VRINDAVAN-MATHURA - AGRA

After breakfast & post check-out, Bid adieu to New Delhi as today you get driven to Agra and En-route visiting Vrindavan and Mathura.

It will take you 02 hour 50 minutes to reach Vrindavan from New Delhi. Vrindavan and Mathura both have many

very attractive temples to visit, but we have curated for you the best must-visit religious places of these holy cities under our one day Mathura and Vrindavan local sightseeing tour. These places are Prem Mandir (Shyama Shyam Dham), Banke Bihari Temple, Sri Krishna- Balaram Temple (ISKCON), Shree Krishna Janambhoomi Temple, Sri Krishna Janmasthan and Sri Krishna Janmabhoomi Temple Complex in Mathura, Dwarkadheesh Temple & Vishram Ghat.





Arrive in Vrindavan. Proceed to visit the Prem Mandir. Imbued with elegance and grandeur, the Prem Mandir is a massive temple that was shaped by Jagadguru Shri Kripaluji Maharaj in the year 2001. Known as "Temple of God's love", this grand religious place is dedicated to Radha Krishna as well as Sita Ram. This newly constructed temple is the most beautiful in the entire Brij area and is crowded with devotees during the time of the Aarti. Made out of white marble and adorned with very intricate carvings, this temple is also famous for its architectural beauty. Statues of Shri Krishna and his admirers, portraying essential occasions surrounding the Lord's life, cover the main temple. Various scenes from Krishna's life, like raising the Govardhan Mountain, have been depicted on the periphery of the Prem Mandir.

Proceed to visit the Bankey Bihari temple at Vrindavan. A trip to Brajbhoomi is incomplete without a visit to one of its most visited temples. Steer through the crowds to catch a glimpse of the lord's idol at Shri Bankey Bihari Temple in Vrindavan. It is believed that the sight of the idol of Shri Krishna in his childhood form is a harbinger of good luck, which is why even the streets of Keshi Ghat, right in front of the temple, remain flooded with pilgrims even before the temple opens.

Continue your drive to reach Mathura.

Proceed to visit the Dwarkadiish temple in Mathura. Ornate murals adorn this shrine in Mathura where Lord Krishna, in his manifestation as Dwarkadhish, sits in the form of a black marble idol. Visit this temple to decipher stories of his life through the stunning ceiling paintings. Entry to the premises is allowed from two gates, which lead to the two-storey structure fronted by an open courtyard flooded with pilgrims.

DAY 04: AGRA TO JAIPUR

Proceed for visit of The Taj Mahal (closed on Friday) -The Taj Mahal is everything that has been said about it and more. Built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan as an expression of his love for his wife Mumtaz Mahal, in mid-17th century, the Taj Mahal is truly one of the wonders of the world. Though the Taj appears to be amazingly perfect from almost any angle, it is the close-up marble inlay work, which is really astounding.



The Agra Fort, an outstanding example of Mughal architecture. Agra Fort - the seat and the stronghold of the Mughal Empire under successive generations. This was the seat of Mughal rule. Shahjahan added the impressive quarters and the mosque while Aurangzeb added the outer ramparts. Visit its Hall of Public Audience and its Royal Pavilions. Besides the historical monuments, one can also explore Agra's rich heritage of handicrafts in its markets.

Now, Bid adieu to Agra as you drive to Jaipur visiting Fatehpur Sikri enroute. Bid adieu to Agra as today you will be driven to Jaipur and En-Route visiting Fatehpur Sikri.

See the Hawa Mahal or Palace of Winds, a major Rajput landmark built in 1799. This five-story building in the old city is a pink sandstone masterpiece with semi octagonal and delicately honeycombed windows. The monument was originally conceived to enable ladies of the royal household to watch the city's everyday life and royal processions in absolute privacy. transfer to hotel.

Jaipur.DAY 05: IN JAIPUR

After breakfast, Proceed for full - day sightseeing of Jaipur.

visiting Amer Fort located at a distance of 11 kilometres from Jaipur and was the old fort of the Kachhwaha clan of Amber. It used to be the capital, till it was moved to Jaipur. The fort is built with white marble and red sandstone and looks even more attractive because of the MaotaLake in the foreground. An elephant [Subject to availability/alternatively by jeep] will spare you the trouble of climbing up to the fortress.





Continue past through the Jalmahal a photostop.

Among the highlights to be seen while touring Jaipur include the City Palace, which is an overwhelming complex of exquisite palaces, gardens and courtyards, decorative art and carved doorways. The palace museum houses collections of rare manuscripts, armours, costumes, carpets and miniature paintings.

Walk to the adjacent Jantar Mantar or Astronomical Observatory made by the Maharaja of Jaipur, built in 1726 and is one of the five such astronomical wonders built by Sawai Jai Singh and makes accurate predictions even to this day. An observatory equipped with instruments of astonishing size and precision, including a 90 foot high sun dial.

Jaipur is a shopper's paradise. Most of the bazaars are in an old city with a wide range of things to buy,
